Purpose of guidance

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The purpose of this guidance is to provide information and guidance for the responsible person, to make an informed decision on the most appropriate way to comply with current legislation.

Definition & Classification

For this guidance the term Mobility Scooter will be used to cover both mobility scooters and mobility buggies (mobility scooters can be dismantled to fit in a vehicle while a buggy can't be dismantled).

Class 2 - max speed 4 mph and weigh up to 113.4kg

Class 3 - Max speed up to 8mph and weigh up to 150kg

Our guidance

Working with the three Welsh FRS we are aiming to have this guidance document ratified so it will become the first port of call for issues relating to mobility scooters.

This guidance document will also be passed to external organisations for their input.

Recommendations

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Mobility Scooters:-

- Charged to manufacturer's instructions.
- Should be routinely serviced/inspected.
- Not stored in an area that is an escape route.
- Charging is to be prohibited in all communal areas.
- Clear information should be given to the tenants.

In flat storage



- The size/width of scooter.
- Representation of the How do they get to the flat.
- The distance to the outside.
- The width of the corridors.
- Use of the lift to get to their floor.
- Thresholds to the entrance of the flat.

Internal store room

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- Ventilation to comply with DSEAR.
- Automatic fire detection.
- Sprinklers if fitted in complex.
- Rays marked on floor with enough room.
- Monitor use of the room.

External Store rooms

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- How many do you require.
- Can you get electrics to the sheds.
- ₩ Where are they to be sited.
- Arson issues.
