# Freventing Eviction Protocol

- Monmouthshire Housing Association has almost 3,800 homes across Monmouthshire, and has the largest number of social homes in the county.
- We have made a commitment to try to prevent evictions.
- This has involved changing the ways in which staff understand people's situations, using a more trauma informed approach as well as a restorative approach to building, maintaining and repairing relationships.





- Product of our Income Review 2020
- Starting point of low evictions and high void standard
- Identified that MHA's services deliver examples of good practice, but there can be a lack of consistency in how they are applied e.g. similar forms – different considerations; different training, application and culture – different teams spot different opportunities and can build different relationships





- Not all teams are involved in the process
- Problem solving can sometimes not be wide enough and has a tendency to focus on issues rather than strengths (hint in the name)
- Needed more visibility of approach and expectations across the teams
- Generally more could be done in respect of communication and earlier

- support vulnerable people over 16 years old or families with multiple and complex needs and/or whom may be in threat of being evicted or homeless.
- The Panel provides a forum for discussion and an opportunity for any individual agency to refer a case in circumstances where other agencies may have a role to play.
- The Panel provides an opportunity to clarify up to date circumstances for the individual or family. Consideration of historic and current support issues/support provision and consideration of the role of other agencies will help inform and determine future actions.
