- Offers a way out of the pandemic
- Sacrifices made over the past year
- Continue to work together





Status

- First dose given to 70% of adults
- One in four adults in Wales completed the two-dose course
- Total of 2,486,446 vaccinations
- Inequality gaps closing but further work needed.



Vaccine Equity

- Fair access and opportunity
- Positive attitudes

Lower uptake poses a risk

Vaccine hesitancy

Delay in acceptance or refusal to receive a vaccination

I am worried about the long-term effects on my health	(49%)
I am worried about the side effects	(47%)
I would want to wait to see how well the vaccine works	(41%)
I do not think it will be safe I do not feel the coronavirus is a personal risk	(35%)
I am worried about a possible link with blood clots	(20%)
I do not think it will work	16%)
I am worried about the effect on existing health conditions	(13%)





Vaccine hesitancy

- Factors are complex and context
- Confidence
- Convenience
- Complacency



Targeted action

- Concerns around side effects and safety
- People with protected characteristics
- Those socio-economic disadvantage
- Those within marginalised or underserved groups



Black, Asian & Minority Ethnic Groups

83% more likely to think the vaccine isn't safe

High exposure to misinformation and conspiracies

Lack of acknowledgment of legitimate concerns

Mainstream media on low take-up is stigmatising communities



Information sources

Use reliable, trustworthy sources

Social media - unreliable and possibly not factual.

Repeating misinformation can reinforce the myth







Tailored communications

- Locally-led approach
- Understand specific concerns and barriers
- Increased scale and intensity of activities
- Trusted voices
- No one left behind
