

Progress and Plans



Progress up to Autumn 2020

Social Landlord Feedback

- WG held a series of workshops with representation from all social landlords over May and June 2020.
- The aim was to listen to the practitioners and to benefit from their experience of working with the standard.
- We asked:
 - What works well
 - · What should we add?
 - What could we take away or update?
 - Reporting
- These sessions were really well attended, really interesting and with great range of views and issues discussed.
- We captured 286 comments
- We summarised and presented this back to the participants in a joint session to give the opportunity to comment on whether we'd got it right.
- The hot topics were predictably decarb and reporting.
- But there was also a lot of really positive feedback about the successes of WHQS and all that it has delivered over it's long history.
- We asked for volunteers to work with us and now have a Go-To group with a cross section of organisations in size, type and location.

Tenant Survey

- WG ran a survey for tenants in Autumn 2020 aiming to
 - investigate tenants' views and knowledge of the WHQS;
 - Gain understanding about views on decarbonisation work to homes;
 - Explore how tenants views about their homes and surrounding environments were impacted by Covid-19
- Our Go-To group and TPAS Cymru helped us develop the survey and to distribute it to tenants (online only).
- Total of 1,016 responses
- Headlines:
 - ➤ 44% of survey respondents reported that they had not heard of the WHQS.
 - All of the seven WHQS criteria were rated by a large majority of respondents as being very important.
 - Most respondents agreed that their homes are meeting WHQS criteria
 - A large majority of respondents reported that they would be happy for work to be done in their home to improve fuel efficiency.

WHQS 2 and Decarbonisation

Independent Summative Evaluation

Title: Welsh Housing Quality Standard (WHQS): Summative Evaluation

Authors: Three Dragons, Cyngor Da and Ulster University - Built Environment Research Institute (BERI)

Why was the report commissioned?

- WHQS has been around since 2002 but has never been formally evaluated by Welsh Government.
- A new standard is being developed now as the existing standard draws to a close.
- We wanted to learn the lessons from the first programme and take recommendations for WHQS

What did we ask for?

The objectives for the research were:

- 1. Assess the extent to which the WHQS has been achieved;
- 2. Reflect the outputs of delivering the standard (including social, economic and well-being, as well as physical improvement to housing stock);
- 3. Apply the findings from the Summative Evaluation to producing recommendations for the development of the revised standard.

Headlines – WG Summary



Has WHQS been achieved?: Yes – the stats show us that the stock has improved significantly. WHQS is never 'finished' and we don't have the most up to date stats due to Covid-19 but we're nearly there.



Outcomes:

• WHQS has provided much more than an improvement in assets – WHQS homes are healthier homes and the programme has provided training and employment in communities all across Wales.



• We need to make sure we capture the information to evidence this better next time round so WHQS can get the recognition it deserves.

Recommendations:



- Tenants and social landlords agreed that WHQS includes the right areas.
- A two stage approach is suggested for decarbonisation and affordable warmth (the first stage focusing on planning and preparing before implementation in the second)
- Flooring and broadband were also mentioned specifically
- We also need to reassess how we measure and report data to allow our monitoring and support to be more data driven.

Development of WHQS 2

RH Environmental Limited (RHE) WHQS2 and Technical Guidance

- We have commissioned RHE to work with us to develop WHQS 2, the technical guidance and the statistical framework we need to measure progress.
- Engagement with the sector on the technical aspects of the standard is underway now.
- RHE will support us through the development of the standard and the consultation process.

Engagement and Consultation

- There will be a 12 week consultation on WHQS2
- As well as the opportunity to formally respond to the consultation, we are planning engagement sessions to run during the consultation.
- Our aim is to raise the profile of WHQS2 and ensure we get a strong response to the consultation.
- It will also help us to gauge opinion, understand the responses better and provide information and explanation around the proposed changes.

Development of WHQS 2

Challenges

- Lot to like in WHQS not throwing the baby out with the bath water
- No-one's got an answer to decarb conundrum – it's a big judgement call
- Many headed beast
- Personnel taking good counsel
- Timelines and sector capacity

Optimised retrofit Programme

- It's the test and learn path way for WHQS. Its all about Proof of Concepts
- Funding wont be forever
- Government doing what its supposed to – pump priming and de risking
- Mainstreaming approaches is the goal like IHP
- We are in this together, and the vanguard of stepping up to the challenges of a global wicked problem

Development of WHQS 2

Summary

- Its coming, steadily, but high quality flagship policy making is taking time. We will get there. In the meantime, engage with us as much as you can, shape and influence we don't want to break you
- ORP 2 is coming and will be the test and learn pathway for WHQS in the longer term. Make the most of our money to help you get your approach right for you
- We will set out a timeline for the consultation asap, but until then business as usual, don't let us stop you doing, what you need to do
