- April '18: Review announced
- July '18: Call for Evidence launched
- Sept. '18: Work streams begin work
- Nov. '18: Annual Conference emerging themes
- Jan April '19: Testing and developing recommendations
- **30**th **April:** Report submitted to Minister
- 1st May: Launch of final report

Our response Three tests

- Will the recommendations deliver more homes?
- Will those homes be genuinely affordable?
- Will those homes be fit for the future?

Our response

Collaboration, Certainty, Flexibility

- Rent: allow HAs to develop their own rent policies to sent rents locally and affordably
- Grant: longer term planning and greater flexibility required, regional zoning
- Standards: greater flexibility, focus on space standards and innovation/decarbonisation, potential for MMC
- Land: greater transparency and partnership working required to deliver on public sector land
- Dowry: longer term certainty required; could unlock significant potential in stock transfers



Key Recommendations

- Reform of rent policy
- Reform of grant distribution and allocation
- Reform of standards
- Reform of policies relating to public sector land

Reform of rent policy

- Long term certainty: a 5 year deal
- Note the UK Government decision: CPI + 1%
- Value for Money

Reform of grant

- Regional approach based on City Deal areas
- Long term programme approach
- Local authority access to grant
- Recognition of diversity and ambition of whole sector

Reform of standards

- New simplified standards for new build grant funded and s106 homes.
- Standards should concentrate on minimum space standards including storage space inside and out.
- Emphasis on zero carbon all new affordable homes from 2021.
- Modern Methods of Construction
- Dowry

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Reform of public sector land

- Public land "agency"
- Encouraging greater transparency and collaboration on large sites
