The Community Investment Fund is a programme that provides up to £10,000 in grant support to community and voluntary groups in Gwynedd, towards a project that will impact positively on the communities and improve quality of life for residents of Gwynedd.

£1.25m funding for communities

COMMUNITIES in Gwynedd are to benefit from a £1.25-million funding scheme over the next five years, thanks to a housing association.

The money has been made available by social housing provider, Cartrefi Gwynedd Gwynedd, with Cystadun responsible for its administration.

As part of its commitment to develop and strengthen communities across the county, CCG has earmarked a benefit package of £250,000 a year. Community and voluntary groups are invited to apply for grants.

Rhys Jones, director of customer and communities at CCG, said: "This is a significant sum of money that we have allocated for community benefit, and it is an important part of the commitment we made to tenants in our offer document."

He added: "I want to encourage groups to make an application for funding, and would like to stress that any voluntary community group can apply, this is not just for the more established groups."

For Rhys Jones, the funding is a "great opportunity for us to support the community and to help them to improve their lives."

£400 boost for community

A DOLGELLAU town councillor has secured a £400 grant to develop the community garden in Dolgellau.

Cllr Ray Stubbs set up the wildlife garden three years ago and applied for the grant to allow them to purchase a greenhouse for the garden. Cllr Stubbs and other volunteers saw a wasteland which they transformed into a Uchaf wildlife garden.

He said: "The grant will help us to develop the garden and to provide a place where people can enjoy the outdoors and watch the plants grow."

Five organisations contributed a total of £35,528.82, with money from the Sustainable Development Fund, Cartrefi Gwynedd, Cystadun, and the Ganolian Trefor.

A NEW facility which aims to boost employment and improve the lives of youngsters in the community will be officially launched next week.

For the best part of a year, staff and volunteers at Caernarfon's Cwmni Hysbyrt Ty'r Ysgol (CITY) have been hard at work constructing the new facility.



Once the roof project is completed the committee is looking to gather further funding to decorate and to install a functional kitchen.

The committee have stated that there will be an official opening once all the work is completed and they are hoping for more funding to help with the project.

Garden project aims to grow

RESIDENTS in Penrhyndeudraeth have pledged their support for a garden project.

The Gardd Deudraeth Project is located in the former Portmeirion nursery, located on the edge of the Portmeirion estate.

The aim of the project is to establish a garden that will produce vegetables, fruit and flowers to sell to the local hotels, restaurants and other businesses.

Deudraeth Cyf managing director, Keneu Morgan, said: "Deudraeth Cyf has secured a lease on the property in order to create the community-based garden to be run as a profitable venture employing four full/part time staff and supported by a team of local volunteers."

Profits from the sale of plants, flowers and fresh vegetables will be used to fund the project and any surplus will be re-invested to improve facilities including creating new jobs for local people and to run educational courses.

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Cartrefi offers grant aid for community groups

PROJECTS across Arfon have received a boost following grant aid from a community purse.
