Purpose – focuses on identifying the barriers and solutions to collaborative working across these sectors. It seeks to identify mechanisms and processes to work together through sharing models and knowledge and scaling-up good practice.

Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) and Housing project

Pilot in Bridgend CBC, the project aims to identify current ACE based approaches in housing across Wales, and to identify and test an ACE informed approach with housing providers and their support services.

It aims to increase and improve early intervention and prevention activity when ACEs are evident in the home environment, and when families need housing related support or are at risk of homelessness.
