Dave has previously worked for IBM where he was a Director of the Institution for Knowledge Management and founded the Cynefin Centre for Organisational Complexity; during that period he was selected by IBM as one of six "on-demand" thinkers for a world-wide advertising campaign. Prior to that he worked in a range of strategic and management roles in the service sector.</p>

	<p>Hear from Richard about Swansea University's leadership strategy, what it means in practice.</p> <p>Professor Davies studied Engineering at Cambridge, and obtained a PhD at Bristol University. His first academic appointment was at Bristol University. Subsequently, he worked in the department of City and Regional Planning at the University of Wales Institute of Science and Technology (UWIST), now Cardiff University. He was appointed to a Chair in Applied Statistics at Lancaster University in 1989. He was successively director of this 5* department, Dean of an Applied Sciences faculty, and then Pro-Vice Chancellor at Lancaster.</p>
