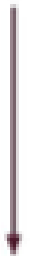

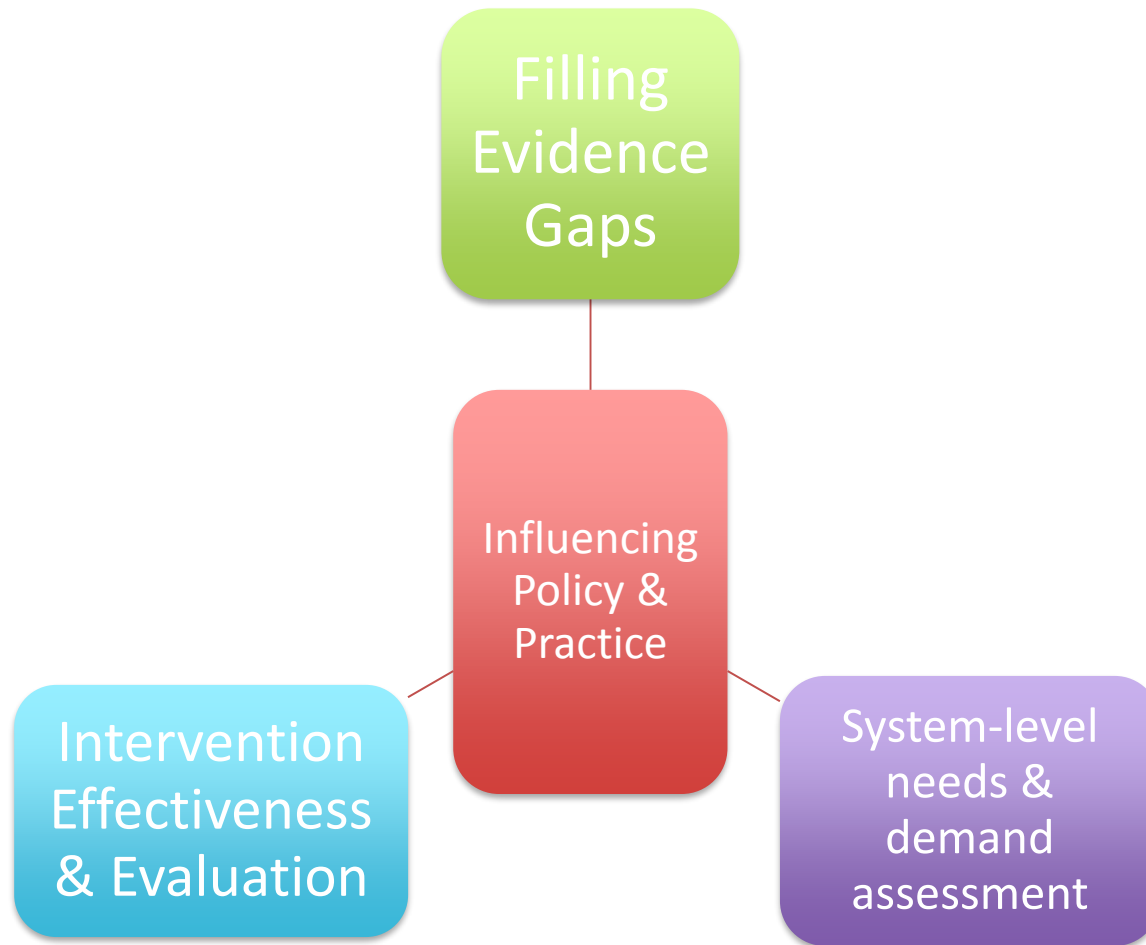
Steve Tiesdell Legacy Collection
